**Introducing your Judge .....**

**Mrs Cath Parker (Osmart)**

I have now been owned by Beardies for over 50 years, these have included CC winners, reserve CC winners, stud book entries and one who was kept purely as a house dog and companion. In the early years I preferred to own dogs including Ch Bravo of Bothkennar and Ch Osmart Bonnie Blue Braid who both ensured their place in the history of the breed. During these years I have owned less than 10 Beardies and have bred less than 10 litters, which may surprise some of the newer exhibitors, but I have always thought quality more important than quantity. In my younger days I handled many of the resident Osmarts at local and championship shows, prior to my mother's (Jenny Osborne) death. I tended to be the one left at home to take care of the kennels on show days with my daughter carrying out the majority of the handling. Now we have fewer dogs, it is possible for me to be more active both attending shows with Robynne along with assisting and supporting her in ensuring the future of Osmart.

I first awarded CCs in 1976 and have judged on many occasions including Breed Club Open and Championship Shows and the bitch classes at Crufts 1992. Overseas judging has included Club and Championship Shows in Canada, Denmark, Sweden and Germany with a club match in America.

In addition I have been showing Skye Terriers since 1968 with some success including CC winners, reserve CC winners and stud book entries. I have been awarding CCs within this breed since 1986 and appointments have included the Breed Club Open, Championship Shows and Crufts 1997

## DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in Breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Monday 20<sup>th</sup> September 2021**. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

**1. WITHDRAWAL.** The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation F(1)19.

**2. TRANSFER.**

- a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height, and in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) For an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

**MINOR PUPPY:** For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

**PUPPY :** For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

**JUNIOR :** For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

**YEARLING :** For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

**NOVICE :** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Open or Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

Continued . . . . .

**DEBUTANT** : For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or a First Prize at a Championship Show where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

**GRADUATE** : For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**POST GRADUATE** : For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/ CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**MID LIMIT**: For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won five or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows, in Mid Limit, Limit or Open Classes confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**LIMIT** : For dogs which have not become show Champions under The Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won seven or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes confined to the breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**OPEN** : For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

**VETERAN** : For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

**SPECIAL VINTAGE** : For dogs of not less than ten years of age on the first day of the Show.

**SPECIAL BEGINNERS** : For owner, handler or exhibit not having won a Challenge Certificate or Reserve Challenge Certificate or Junior Warrant.

**SPECIAL OPEN** : For dogs both owned and bred in Scotland.

***Please note:*** Exhibitors applying for membership for the first time **must** complete the Membership Application Form and read the Club Code of Conduct on the reverse side of the Entry Form.

***Please note:*** Photographs may be taken at this event, the subsequent use of which is outwith the control of the club. Accordingly, the Club can take no responsibility for the use or display of still or moving pictures taken at any of our shows. Any concerns must be taken up with the photographers in question.

## **REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION – F (B)**

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club licensed event. Objections may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and / or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A11.
  - (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
  - (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A11.
2.
  - (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
  - (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
  - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the Board.
  - (b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.
  - (c) Operations to prevent breeding, providing that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the Board to deceive.
4. The Board without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from The Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the show or by anyone so deputed by The Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

## The Kennel Club Code of Ethics

### **Breeders/Owners:**

1. Will properly house, feed, water and exercise all dogs under their care and arrange for appropriate veterinary attention if, and when required.
  2. Will agree without reservation that any veterinary surgeon who performs an operation on any of their dogs which alters the natural conformation of the animal, or who carries out a caesarean section on a bitch, may report such operation to The Kennel Club.
  3. Will agree that no healthy puppy will be culled. Puppies which may not conform to the Breed Standard should be placed in suitable homes.
  4. Will abide by all aspects of the Animal Welfare Act.
  5. Will not create demand for, nor supply, puppies that have been docked illegally.
  6. Will agree not to breed from a dog or bitch which could be in any way harmful to the dog or to the breed.
  7. Will not allow any of their dogs to roam at large or to cause a nuisance to neighbours or those carrying out official duties.
  8. Will ensure that their dogs wear properly tagged collars and will be kept leashed or under effective control when away from home.
  9. Will clean up after their dogs in public places or anywhere their dogs are being exhibited.
  10. Will only sell dogs where there is a reasonable expectation of a happy and healthy life and will help with the rehoming of a dog if the initial circumstances change.
  11. Will supply written details of all dietary requirements and give guidance concerning responsible ownership when placing dogs in a new home.
  12. Will ensure that all relevant Kennel Club documents are provided to the new owner when selling or transferring a dog, and will agree, in writing, to forward any relevant documents at the earliest opportunity, if not immediately available.
  13. Will not sell any dog to commercial dog wholesalers, retail pet dealers or directly or indirectly allow dogs to be given as a prize or donation in a competition of any kind. Will not sell by sale or auction Kennel Club registration certificates as stand alone items (not accompanying a dog).
  14. Will not knowingly misrepresent the characteristics of the breed nor falsely advertise dogs nor mislead any person regarding the health or quality of a dog.

## SHOW ENTRIES AND BANK CHARGES

Exhibitors' attention is drawn to the Kennel Club announcement that any Bank Charges incurred by the Club through incorrectly completed or dishonoured cheques in respect of their entries will be passed on to the Exhibitor concerned. Failure to pay these charges will result in the exhibitor being dealt with by the Kennel Club Committee.

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### RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The show will open at 8.45 a.m.
2. Dogs will be received at any time, but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 9.30 a.m.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. **ENTRY FEES:**  
Members £12.00 First Entry; Non-Members £17.00 First Entry  
Subsequent Entries (same dog) £1.50 (Members & Non-Members);  
Special Vintage Class £1.00; Not for Competition: FREE;  
**Membership:** Single £6.00; Joint £7.00; Junior £1.00;  
**Catalogue:** Prepaid £2.00 (£2.50 on the day).
6. **Prize Money:** Total prize money available at this show is £125
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition. However puppies of four months or over may be entered Not For Competition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **BEST PUPPY IN SHOW.** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.
11. **BEST IN SHOW:** Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of 10 minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulations F (Annex B) – Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority To Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority To Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

- 16. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS:** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events:
- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
  - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
  - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
  - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
  - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
  - Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
  - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

**Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.**

**WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK, FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**

- 17.** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club rules and regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by The Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
- 18.** Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
- 19.** No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the Board of The Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the canine press wherever possible.
- 20.** All entries must be made before **27<sup>th</sup> September 2021** upon forms issued for that purpose.
- 21.** The entrance fee of a dog entered and not exhibited will be forfeited.
- 22.** The Committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage to dogs or other property, whether or not caused by any act or omission of themselves or their agents.
- 23.** Should any judge be prevented from fulfilling their engagement, the Committee reserve to themselves the right of appointing other judges to fulfil their duties. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no fees can be refunded.
- 24.** If in the opinion of the Show Secretary, Show Manager or Judge any dog is considered not in a fit state for exhibition owing to disease, savage disposition or any other cause, the dog may be excluded or removed from the show on the instruction of the Show Management. Once excluded or removed from the Show, the dog must not be brought into the Show at any time under any circumstances. If such exclusion takes place either before or after the dog is judged, the entrance fee will be forfeited.
- 25.** The exhibitor making an entry for this Show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by the Kennel Club rules and regulations, and it is on this understanding only that entries are accepted.
- 26. ALL EXHIBITORS, OWNERS AND HANDLERS ARE REQUIRED TO CLEAR UP ANY FOULING BY DOGS IN THEIR CHARGE.**

## ***Directions to Lanark Agricultural Centre***

- ▶ **Restricted junctions** - 11 & 12 are restricted. Those coming from the South and returning South use Junction 12; to & from the North, use Junction 11. There is no southbound J12 exit, and no northbound J11 exit; the B7078 serves as a connecting link to the A70.
- ▶ **From the South** - Exit M74 at junction 12 (Happenden), then follow the A70 (signed Edinburgh & Lanark). At Hyndford Bridge turn left onto the A73 for Lanark. The Agricultural Centre (Auction Market) is 1½ miles from the bridge, on the left at the mini roundabout.
- ▶ **From the North** - Exit M74 at junction 11, taking the B7078 past the services to reach the J12 roundabout; thereafter follow directions from the South.
- ▶ **From the M8** - Instead of the M74, you can take the A73 south through Lanark, and the Agricultural Centre will be on the right. (The route from J7 via the A72 to Lanark to meet the A73 is very windy and slow.)
- ▶ **From the East** - from the East of England, it is easiest to get across to the M6...M74, and follow directions from the South.
- ▶ **From the Edinburgh area** - take the A702, then one of the following:
  - A721 to Carstairs, A70 to Hyndford Bridge, & A73.
  - A702 until past Biggar, then A72, and A73 towards Lanark.
- ▶ **From the West** - The A71 is the best road from the West coast. Then Take the M74 southbound, leaving at J11, and follow the B7078 to the junction 12 roundabout; thereafter follow directions from the South.
